Month of September 2025

- The Creamery discharges are still bad at times. Samples have gotten a better but still are extremely thick for testing. We have increased adding bugs due to this issue.
- We have installed air actuator on SBR #2.
- We have finished draining #1 digester and has been cleaned. We did find a lot of broken diffusers and repaired broken pipe. Tested system everything is working to specs and was put back online.
- Drum filters are still in progress; I am waiting on quotes from Koester associates and Stewart Equipment. Still trying to locate a 3rd vender I do believe this is going to be expensive. We will need to budget for these.
- We are getting to go into winter permit at the end of October. This should be a smooth transition.
- The facility and system are looking great and is well within permit.
